The deep bowl offers hips galore and pool coping. The mini bowl spins into the mid bowl with steel coping, complete with an over vert pocket and loveseat on the vert wall. If you haven't had a chance to bark out a grind on pool coping, check out the YMCA park in Mukilteo. You will be stoked.

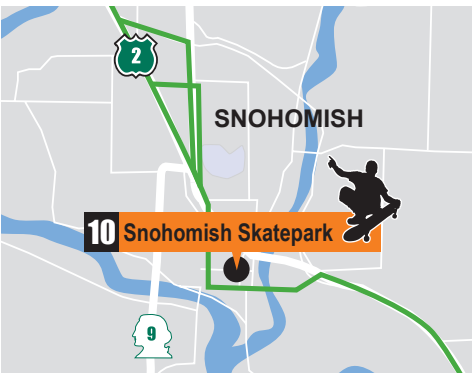
